TECHNICAL REPORT – Jo-Anne Borgford

The 2019-2020 Season has been like no other. During the season we were able to pull off 3 coaching clinics. First and foremost, I would like to send out a special thank you to people who have helped to make this possible. Fran Clarke, Jason Kennedy and Joan Ritchie. As well as to Lincoln Lanes in Vernon, Scottsdale Lanes in Surrey and Black Diamond Lanes in Prince George for their donation of the room and lanes

I am excited to confirm that we were successful in completing a Competitive Level course in Prince George in October 2019. We had 9 in attendance. Not all of the 9 have yet to complete their assessments but I am hoping once we are able to work around COVID-19, we will be able to get them certified as Competitive coaches.

We also completed 2 Community level courses during the season. One in Vernon in November 2019 with 7 in attendance and one in Surrey in March 2020 with 8 in attendance.

I am pleased to announce that Jason Kennedy is just one course away from becoming a Competitive Course Facilitator. This is something we need so that we can ensure courses are put on in different areas of the province. With Jason being from the Prince George area, he has the ability to assist with more courses in the north and interior. In addition, I have now completed my final course to become a Community Course Facilitator giving us additional coverage for more courses.

I am excited to announce that most of our current Competitive Coaches have completed the Respect the Sport course online. It is required to be completed to ensure that you maintain your credentials. Easter Chocolates are always popular and Purdy's are the best. A slow start to this event was offset by a huge boost from Theresa Moffat and the people of Terrace. We raised \$1200.00.

MBABC 50/50

We have had a great start to our first major 50/50 event and are well on our way to raising our goal of \$10,000.00. The draw is open to everyone so tell your friends.

RULES AND REGULATIONS – Kim Wilson

Due to Covid issues changing from the way we normally do things seems to now be the norm, and bowling is no exception. The famous US politician John Lewis was famous for saying "When you see something you do something" which means if a law/rule was wrong you changed it.

Some changes are for the positive and I believe a couple of these changes were needed. Some changes will give us more flexibility in case of emergency thru no fault of our own. Below are some of the changes we have made or will vote on at this meeting. In no order of priority.

- Thru a ministerial order we could postpone our AGM and be allowed to have a virtual meeting even though our current By-laws state otherwise. This is in effect while the Provincial Emergency Plan is in effect. We are going to now change our By-laws so that virtual meetings are now allowed under certain circumstances. Doing this will also allow people to participate that did not qualify for provincials or unable to attend the AGM.
- This also brought to light that our not allowing Proxy voting in our By-laws was quite outdated. When these types of By-laws were brought in there was a variety of reasons this was not acceptable practice, but situations have now changed. We will require a set process that must be followed.
- We will now be required to follow additional rules during this Covid crisis. We have received a copy of these rules from Via Sport and will also supply you with a list of MBABC rules which encompasses these rules. One critical element of these rules is a Communication Plan if a MBABC bowler, proprietor staff member, league bowler or open plan bowler tests positive for Covid. The Plan will entail who is notified and what, in any, quarantine must take place. The Provincial Health Officer makes all final decisions on these matters and all existing rules are subject to change with little to no notice. A Communication & Emergency Contingency Plan will be included in the rules where it is deemed appropriate.
- Rules concerning existing provincial championships format may change if Covid conditions still exist. Basically, a secondary rule will be included in the rules that state that under emergence conditions an alternative provincial format may be used.
- Rules can always be reworded if the original intent of a rule has not been altered in any way. Sometimes this is for additional clarity, spelling, easier reading or in some cases certain words suddenly become inappropriate. This happens more times than you think.
- Rules cannot be interpreted in any other way except as written. The word "will" is a clear and concise meaning. Separate agreements can be used in conjunction with a rule as long as the board is made aware prior and has given its approval.

Overall, the Rules & Regs, By-laws and Constitution are basically a living document in that if the original intent of a Rule, By-law or aspects of Constitution has changed we must change with it, but also, on the flip side, if a rule needs to be included for ethically based reasons, by our laws we must comply and address the issue head on and in some of those cases not everybody will agree.

OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE – Kim Wilson

This Masters season has been like the opening line of the Dickens novel “The Tale of Two Cities”. It was the best of times, it was the worst of times.

As in all Oversight Reports the main objective is to look at areas we can improve and to point out areas or process that need quick attention. Masters needs to be accountable not only to fellow bowlers but also to the Proprietors, Provincial Government (Societies Act), Via Sport and now the Provincial Health Officer.

To be accountable we must have standards, protocols, rules and procedures in place so we can monitor this compliance and have something measurable so we can easily see if we are succeeding or failing to uphold these standards. People throughout history change and adapt to make their world a better place for everyone, and this is one step in that process.

The following are some of the main areas that need our attention. I will also point out some of the issues we are addressing that are already pointing us in the right direction. Not everyone will agree or in some cases even understand why we need some of these changes, but in a nutshell that’s why oversight is critical as groups easily fall into patterns of “that’s the way we have always done it” or “it’s a lot easier to do it this way” where in fact that is why a lot of govt and programs fail. These are not in order of priority.

- Masters must develop a form that is used for every tournament for the collection of money. This form will easily indicate who has paid, amount paid, method of payment and the total of money collected that will be deposited. This will give an accurate and tractable account of all monies collected and deposited and will ensure that all players on the lanes have in fact paid all monies owing. There will be one standard form method used by everyone.
- If a rule states “will” there cannot be any variation of that rule without permission of the board prior to any decisions being made. Rules need to be clear and concise or they serve no value. Separate agreements can be utilized in conjunction with the rule if needed.
- Masters needs a Communication Plan as dictated by Via Sport and Provincial Health Officer in case one of our Master Bowlers, Proprietors staff or league bowler tests positive for Covid. This plan will also address who may need to quarantine if the circumstances dictate.
- Masters needs to develop a contingency plan in case Nationals and/or Provincials are cancelled. This would also apply to us if we are hosting. We all know now this can and may happen again.
- In conjunction with a Business Plan we need to have an organized and measurable plan on how to increase membership each year.
- Due to ever increasing costs, various bowling alley closures and Covid issues it has been discussed that bowling in zones may be a viable option. Although not a perfect scenario, if travel is further restricted within certain areas of the province this would still enable people to compete. Even if it is just a one-year trial basis.
- In conjunction with a Sponsorship Policy we need to develop a Sponsorship Framework which will help decide what type of sponsors MBABC does not want to get ourselves involved with. What standards do we want to adopt in picking sponsors, or not picking sponsors?

Below are items we are addressing which makes MBABC more accountable in the eyes of Via Sport and hopefully future sponsors.

- Developing a consistent Business Plan that will cover all aspects of MBABC. It shows we follow Policies, Code of Conduct, Ethics Code, Core Values and a Mission Statement which makes our Board and members accountable for their actions.
- Developing a Sponsorship and Fundraising Policy which shows that any monies received will be distributed where warranted and all funds raised are accountable to the members.

In closing I think our Board members and the members work hard to ensure that this sport we love will be around for generations to come. It's not always easy and we have to also appreciate and respect the hard work the Proprietors do to support out truly Canadian sport of 5 pin bowling.

their division and if there are no nominations then leave it to the board. The Board will discuss this at their next meeting.

2021 NATIONALS – Joan Ritchie

As of July, Alberta is intending to hold the championships and this will be in Edmonton. Early arrivals are June 28 but we will be going there on June 29. The departures from Edmonton will be July 4. The hotel is the Fantasyland Hotel at West Edmonton mall and the Bowling centre will be Bonnie Doon Lanes. We will be getting further information at our meeting in January and this will be passed on to everyone at the appropriate time with information regarding player costs.

NEW BUSINESS

NEW RULES FOR TOURNAMENTS 2020-2021– Joan Ritchie

We are booking the tournaments as per usual but keep in mind that we could possibly not be attending any on the date booked. Also, please be advised that these rules could change without notice as we are required to abide by the Provincial Health guidelines at the time we are participating. The below rules are also included in the rules provided by Via Sport

- Pre-registration is MANDATORY. We cannot accept any person deciding that day to attend. Any bowlers not pre-registered will not be allowed to bowl
- You can still pay your Membership fees and Tournament Entry fees at the first tournament. Tournament Director must be advised in advance that you are attending.
- There will be a questionnaire on the registration table asking three questions regarding Covid-19 that everyone will have to answer to ensure we are all safe. If you feel ill in any way DO NOT ATTEND.
- Absolutely NO SPECTATORS.
- We may be required to wear a mask upon entering the venue, but it can be taken off once we get to our assigned lane.
- Please proceed to your assigned lane as soon as entering the facility; we will be making necessary arrangements for payment of applicable fees so that the staff is not put in a position of having to handle money. An envelope per lane is one of the possible options.
- We will not be changing lanes as usual but staying on the assigned lane.
- We will not be allowed to “High Five”, it is suggested to use the fist or elbow.
- As required by Via Sport there will be a Masters Communication Plan that will be enacted if a Master Bowler has a positive Covid test and advisements and potential quarantines will be put in place as per direction from the Provincial Health Officer
- All bowlers will be expected to abide by these rules at all times and ensure that our bowling environment is not only safe for all bowlers and also proprietors staff that Master Bowlers may interact with

Iain Walker said that the centre has to know beforehand if the people on the lanes are crossing over or not. We could bowl 4 games on one lane, have a break for sanitation and bowl 4 games on another pair.

PROPOSALS/MOTIONS

PROPOSAL by Clive Moir – for the Senior division, that the ring/pendant will be awarded to the National team member who has the most combined wins from both Scratch and P.O.A.

MOVED by Kim Wilson, seconded by Robbie Perkins. Carried.

PROXY VOTE – Kim Wilson

MOTION by Kim Wilson, seconded by Mike Wood That we allow Proxy voting provided all requirements and guidelines are followed.

Jo-Anne was concerned that a vote could be pushed through if you have 5 proxy votes. The Proxy vote would only be for people not participating in the Provincial finals. These people will be allowed to vote by proxy with strict guidelines in place.

91% for 9% against. Carried.

PROPOSAL Regarding Singles for Tournament Division – Rhonda McDougall and Laurie Stefurak
You can decline singles at the beginning of the season. You should be able to decline singles based on results. If everyone declines then the first person would have to go. As the Tournament division didn't have a quorum no voting could be done.

REPORT FROM BOWLBC – Jason and Salina Kennedy

Due to Covid-19 the C5 will be accepting perfect games that are bowled on 1 (one) lane. If we do not crossover then you can do two frames at a time.

National tournaments are a go – Inter-Provincial and the Youth Challenge. B.C. is hosting the Inter Provincial in the Okanagan; Kelowna and Vernon.

If your glasses or an earring go over the foul line it is not a foul but if something falls out of your pocket like a pen then it is a foul.
